A Letter from Our Board President and Executive Director



Last year, 200 charitable organizations relied on our Online Volunteer Referral Service and in-person interviews that match volunteers to meaningful opportunities. The OVRS averaged over 6,000 visits a month and made 34,771 referrals – a 7% increase over 2015. Youth engagement remained a key focus, representing over 21,000 of our referrals. A seed grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation allowed us to launch the Youth LEaD program pilot, where high school students participate in workshops and complete a project to demonstrate their new skills. During National Volunteer Week, we launched our inaugural V-Oscars gala to roll out the red carpet and celebrate incredible volunteers nominated by our member organizations across Peel.

We embarked on a visioning session with the board and staff to determine our strategic direction for the next three years. We recognize that if we want to empower the voluntary sector through community engagement, learning and capacity building, we need to seek diversified and sustainable revenue sources, invest and maximize the use of technology and further develop our team skills. We will focus on our online learning system, Vetch, which will enable volunteers, board directors and voluntary sector professionals to take part in interactive learning anywhere and anytime. We are excited to implement our new strategic plan, which provides us with a clear direction for the next three years.

We would like to thank our Board of Directors, our 537 volunteers and staff who have tirelessly committed their time and energy to the success of Volunteer MBC. To our funders, sponsors and donors, thank you for supporting us through another year of incredible growth. Our successes are the direct result of the support, commitment and enthusiasm of the Volunteer MBC family and especially the incredible volunteers who help us grow caring, connected and inclusive communities throughout Peel.



Youth LEaD – Received a seed grant from Ontario Trillium Foundation to run this pilot project. Youth LEaD is a learning series that develops project planning, volunteer engagement, project excellence, and leadership skills in youth to organize community service projects and to professionally execute them with the support of Volunteer MBC.

In 2016, Volunteer MBC's Step Up Youth Volunteer Ambassadors (SUYVA) engaged over 500 youth contributing over 1,500 volunteer hours spread over 10 youth led events. SUYVA conducted 20 Planning Meetings that involved over 70 youth ambassadors.

To increase our outreach in Caledon and engagement of their residents, we became an active partner of the Caledon Exchange Collaborative at 55 Healey Road in Bolton. The Exchange is operated by Caledon Community Services and has a focus on nutritious food and community programs designed to enrich lives. The Collaborative Group now boasts fifteen community service organizations with a shared vision of a thriving and inclusive Caledon community.



We believe that collectively, we can better address the community's interests and needs while also supporting the priorities of each and every Exchange leader and partner. Most of the partners are members of Volunteer MBC which provides

a great platform to support them with their volunteer recruitment and learning opportunities.

In October & November 2016, staff from more than 40 community service organizations engaged in a project organized by Volunteer MBC in association with the Peel Elder Abuse Prevention Network (PEAPN) via funding from the Ontario Senior Secretariat. Three events in the three municipalities were held to give an opportunity to community service organizations to learn strategies to enhance/increase senior volunteer engagement in their organizations.

For the past 9 years, the Ontario Volunteer Centre Network (OVCN), via funding from the Ministry of Citizenship and Immigration selected Volunteer MBC to manage the ChangeTheWorld" annual Youth Volunteer Challenge Campaign by providing support to 24 Volunteer Centres to connect

youth to meaningful volunteer opportunities in their community. In 2016, we helped to engage over 67,300 high school students who volunteered for 376,073 hours to hundreds of community and school events across Ontario. In Peel, 8,686 youth participated in ChangeTheWorld contributing more than 34,000 hours during 180 events.

Volunteer MBC offered board development learning to 107 board members via a very successful 4-part Board Governance Series.

Created a successful partnership with Town of Caledon to deliver board governance training series for 25 affiliated sports groups with a focus on volunteer risk management.
