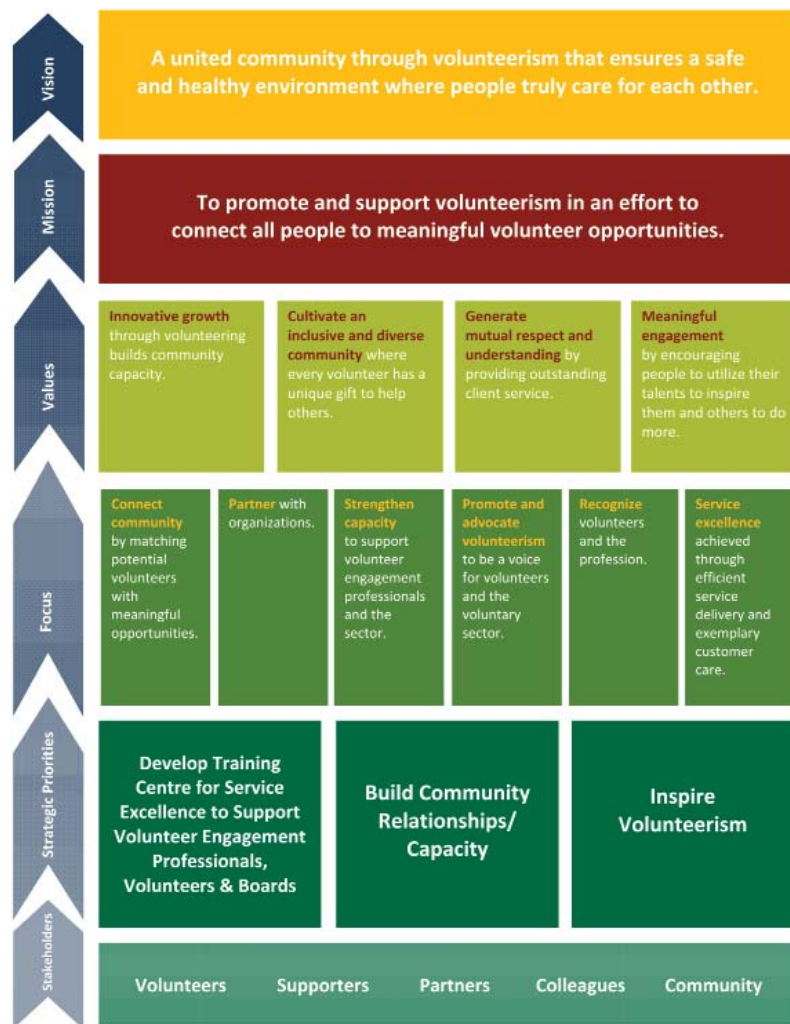

# 2014: A Year in Review

- We were able to reach out to over **31,000 people** in person to promote the benefits of volunteering throughout Peel;
- Through our one-on-one volunteer referral/consulting service and our on-line referral database, we **connected close to 30,978 individuals** to volunteer roles in our community;
- We welcomed **119,310 unique visitors to our website**, an increase of 10.2%;
- Our local *ChangeTheWorld - Ontario Youth Volunteer Challenge* was held in April/May and **engaged 7,520 youth in 328 events. Together they accumulated an astounding 30,690 volunteer hours** over the 6 week campaign;
- Our bi-weekly “*I Care...I Volunteer*” e-newsletter reached **over 12,000 volunteers with each issue**, while thousands more individuals were reached via various media outlets (i.e. Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn, etc.) to direct them to our website and online volunteer database;
- Via our Volunteer Engagement Survey, out of the 268 respondents, **97.4% indicated that they would use our services again and 93.3% indicated that their volunteer match was good to excellent**;
- Volunteer MBC’s Step Up Youth Volunteer Ambassadors engaged **400 peers in 7 SUYVA lead events, contributing 2,000 volunteer hours**;
- Our membership continued to grow to serve over **190 community service organizations and partners**;
- **81.8% of our members indicated that our referral service increased their capacity.**

# A Letter from Our Board President

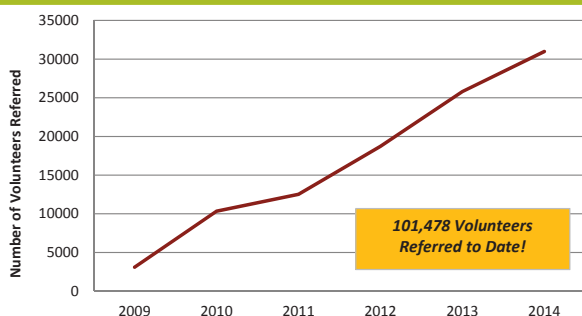

# Growing Communities Together

- For the past 5 years, the Ontario Volunteer Centre Network (OVCN), via funding from the Ministry of Citizenship, Immigration & International Trade (MCIIT) selected **Volunteer MBC to manage the “ChangeTheWorld” annual Youth Volunteer Challenge Campaign** by providing support to 24 Volunteer Centres to connect youth to meaningful volunteer opportunities in their community. In 2014, we helped to engage close to 40,000 high school students who volunteered for 210,000 hours to hundreds of community and school events in Ontario.
- MCIIT has provided \$1.5M for a two-year Volunteer Certification Initiative project, which is tied to the upcoming Pan Am / Parapan Am Games. **Volunteer MBC, on behalf of the OVCN, is responsible for the administration to help deliver the PREB Ontario Volunteer Legacy Initiative to support volunteer recognition.** PREB will be used to certify 23,000 Games volunteers and to provide a lasting legacy piece to recognize thousands of volunteers and the skill-sets they gain with community service organizations for years to come.
- In the Fall of 2014, **Volunteer MBC, in partnership with Rogers TV Peel Region, pre-taped a 13-part series titled “I Care...I Volunteer”.** The series promotes volunteerism and puts the spotlight on volunteers, community service organizations, and the programs and services provided by Volunteer MBC. The shows began airing in January, 2015.
- Volunteer MBC is the lead organization for a collaborative, funded by the Ontario Trillium Foundation, to pilot a **shared service model in volunteer development and management** with Vita Centre, Family Education Centre and Catholic Family Services of Peel and Dufferin. Year one has been completed successfully. Based on volunteer audits, many best practices in volunteer infrastructure development in all participating organizations have already been implemented and as a result their volunteer capacity is increasing and gaining momentum.
